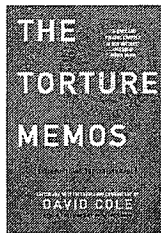

David Cole is a professor at Georgetown University Law Center, a volunteer staff attorney for the Center for Constitutional Rights, a legal affairs correspondent for *The Nation*, a regular contributor to *The New York Review of Books* and a commentator on National Public Radio's *All Things Considered*. He is the author of six books. *Less Safe, Less Free: Why America Is Losing the War on Terror*, published in 2007, won the Palmer Civil Liberties Prize for best book on national security and civil liberties. *Enemy Aliens: Double Standards and Constitutional Freedoms in the War on Terrorism*, received the American Book Award in 2004. His most recent book is *The Torture Memos: Rationalizing the Unthinkable*, published by The New Press in September 2009.

Since 9/11, he has been involved in many of the nation's most important cases involving civil liberties and national security, including the case of Maher Arar, a Canadian citizen rendered to Syria and tortured there.
